

 July 31, 2010—Commissioning of the U.S.S. Missouri at Groton, Connecticut

Representative Ike Skelton keynotes U.S.S. Missouri SSN-780 Christening

U.S. Congressmen Ike Skelton keynoted the Christening of the new Virginia Class Submarine, U.S.S. Missouri. The U.S.S. Missouri is the seventh in a class of Nuclear Attack Submarines. On a very cold and wet, December 5th, the families, quests and crew of the sub assembled at General Dynamics Electric Boat yard in Groton, Connecticut. Congressman Skelton noted that his connection to the Navy extended to his grandfather, Ike Skelton, who was a coal-stoker in third vessel named for our State, U.S.S. Missouri BB-11. He went on to say that the old battleship Missouri was part of the Great White Fleet that President Roosevelt sent on the around-the-world cruise. He noted that this marked the beginning of the United States as World Naval Power. Congressmen Skelton went on to say that with the U.S.S. Missouri BB-63 being stricken from the Naval Vessel Registry, that this name was available for naming this vessel after the 24th State of the Union. During the ceremony, Chairman Skelton presented the ship's crew with two flags: a Missouri state flag, which flew over the State Capitol in Jefferson City, and a United States flag, which has been flown over the U.S. Capitol in Washington. 
U.S.S. Missouri Christening—Supported by the Missouri National Guard. Brigadier General Steven Danner, the Adjutant General for the Missouri National Guard led a group of Missourians to the U.S.S. Missouri christening. He along with several members of his Air Guard, flew a C-130 of the 139th Squadron to Quonset Point National Guard Base in Rhode Island. The delegation included members of the Employers Support to the Guard and Reserves (ESGR). Members of the U.S.S. Missouri Commissioning Committee and Navy Leaguers from the St. Louis, Kansas City and Mid-Missouri Council were invited to fill out the space available on the aircraft. General Dynamics Electric Boat provided transportation to the hotel and christening. After the christening, there was a reception with dignitaries followed by a quick tour of the U.S.S.
